(I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a cigarette butt on the playground located at the rear of childcare center and next to a wooden fence. The cigarette butt was accessible to the children; therefore creating a health and safety hazard.

During interview, the director stated she would have the cigarette butt removed from the area.

Based on observation of the restrooms, the surveyor found:

- 1. Located in restroom one (1), the Softsoap available for children to wash their hands stated "Keep Out of Reach of Children". Therefore, creating a safety hazard.
- 2. Located in restroom two (2), the Image Essential soap available for children to wash their hands stated "Keep out of Reach of Children". Therefore, creating a safety hazard.

During interview, the director stated she would replace the liquid soaps.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
- 1. High school diploma:
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation presented for review and interview, the surveyor found that a staff (DOH: 02/04/19) record did not contain proof of education as required by regulations.

During interview, the director stated she would acquire the information and place it in the staff file.

410 - Training **Not In Compliance** 

# 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation provided and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The surveyor was able to verify that a staff (DOH: 05/08/00) had obtained only eight (8) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training.
- 2. The surveyor was able to verify that a staff (DOH: 11/20/98) had obtained only four (4) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training.
- 3. The surveyor was able to verify that a staff (DOH: 08/09/10) had obtained only eight (8) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training.
- 4. The surveyor was able to verify that a staff (DOH: 03/10/03) had obtained only four (4) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training.
- 5. The surveyor was able to verify that a staff (DOH: 08/20/11) had obtained only eight (8) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training.
- 6. The surveyor was able to verify that a staff (DOH: 03/31/14) had obtained only four (4) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training.

During interview, the director stated she was aware that training was not completed for these staff members.

This deficiency was also cited during a Renewal Inspection for 2018 for two (2) of the six (6) staff. The ongoing compliance on the Plan of Correction for the 2018 Renewal stated, "I will check employee file weekly to make sure all employee are in compliance with training hours."

- (2) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section or Section 2(2)(c) of this administrative regulation, an infant or toddler under twentyfour (24) months of age shall not participate in an activity with an older child for no more than one (1) hour per day.
- (3) If a toddler is developmentally appropriate for a transition to a preschool age group, a toddler may participate in an activity with an older child for more than one (1) hour per day if:
- (a) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;
- (b) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child;
- (c) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with either age group: and
- (d) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

# Findings:

General: During a tour of the child care center, the surveyor asked the teachers in a classroom for the age of the children. The surveyor found that two (2) year old children and three

During interview with the director, it was found that the children did not have the proper documentation for transitioning the two (2) year old children into the three year old classroom. The director stated she would obtain the documentation from the parents for the children's files.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that a can of Coca-Cola was placed on the half wall next to the Infant Classroom and the hallway leading to the restrooms. The Coca-Cola was visiable and accessible to the children.

During interview, the surveyor found that the Coca-Cola belonged to a staff person.

During interview, the director stated she was not aware the times were not posted and would document times.

General: Based on review of documentation presented for review, the surveyor found that the monthly fire drills had been practiced; however, the times of the drills had not been recorded since 07/2018.

During interview, the director stated she was not aware the times were not posted and would document times.
