1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

# 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that one (1) staff (DOH: 03/31/14) file did not contain documentation of a current TB skin test. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the staff person should have an updated TB skin test; however, she could not locate the documentation. Staff-in-charge stated that the staff person had a COVID19 vaccination over four (4) weeks ago.

(2) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section or Section 2(2)(c) of this administrative regulation, an infant or toddler under twentyfour (24) months of age shall not participate in an activity with an older child for no more than one (1) hour per day.

(3) If a toddler is developmentally appropriate for a transition to a preschool age group, a toddler may participate in an activity with an older child for more than one (1) hour per day if:

(a) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;

(b) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child;

(c) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with either age group; and

(d) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

# Findings:

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General: Based on interview, the surveyor learned that one (1) two-year-old child was in the same classroom as the three- and four-year-old children. Through interview with staff-incharge, the surveyor learned that the child had been in the mixed-age group for longer than one (1) hour. Staff-in-charge also stated that she had a transition plan for the two-year-old child; however, she could not locate the documentation.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

1. A bottle of Equate Clear Liquid Hand Soap placed on the sink in the second restroom that stated "Keep Out of the Reach of Children" on the back of the bottle.

2. A mop bucket with dirty water inside it that was placed beside a sink that is located next to the diaper changing table.

3. A mop, broom, and dust pan placed in between the first and second restrooms.

4. A green plastic stick attachment, Swiffer, and shovel placed beside the exit door outside on the playground.

5. An ashtray with a cigarette butt inside of it placed beside the exit door outside on the playground.

6. Two (2) brooms, a small vacuum, and a mop placed out in the open near the Infant Classroom.

7. A purse that was placed out in the open on a half wall by the Infant Classroom. Through interview with staff-in-charge, the surveyor learned that the purse belonged to a staff person.

The items mentioned were observed to be within reach and accessible to the children.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found two (2) green child sized plates laying on a picnic table, one (1) green child sized plate and one (1) sippy cup handle attachment laying on the concrete by the picnic table. Staff-in-charge stated that the children play with the green plates; however, she would remove them from the playground.

### 750 - Playground Conditions

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(20) An outdoor play area shall be:

(d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;

- (e) Well drained;
- (f) Well maintained;

(g) In good repair; and

# (h) Visible to staff at all times.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation of the playground, the surveyor found a black line dangling from the roof of the child-care center that was located on the side of the building in front of the meter. The black line appeared to be connected on the roof and was observed to be within reach and accessible to the children; therefore, the playground was not safe from foreseeable hazard.

During interview, staff-in-charge stated that she was not aware of the black line dangling from the roof and was unsure what the line is connected too. Staff-in-charge also stated that she would have the black line fixed to not be accessible to the children as soon as possible.
