# 922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(8) A child shall not be required to stand or sit for a prolonged period of time:

(a) During an activity;

(b) While waiting for an activity to start; or

# (c) As punishment.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the following was found:

(1) All children, infants to school-age, are required to remain seated in high chairs and at tables for a minimum of thirty (30) minutes after they have finished eating snack. The children are offered no activities during this time.

(2) The daily schedule indicates that snack time is from 2:30 PM until 3:30 PM; thus, this allows too much time upon completing snack to continue sitting without participation in a developmentally appropriate activity.
