Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, staff member hired 8/14/2019, did not have proof of educational qualifications in their personnel file.

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410 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on observation,

1.) Two staff members hired 7/18/2017 and 10/27/2017, did not have evidence of completing Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training. This training is to be completed within the first year of employment. Additionally, staff member hired 12/21/2001, had a Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training that had exceeded five years; the training was conducted 2/16/2014, and therefore expired 2/16/2019. Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training should be taken every five years.

Programming In Compliance Premises Not In Compliance 520 - Inaccessible Items Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements. (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:

(a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;

(b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and

(c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation,

1.) There was a gallon of disinfectant cleaner stored in an unlocked shelf in the school-aged classroom.

2.) There were disinfectant wipes stored in the bottom of an unlocked cabinet in the four- to five-year-old classroom. The instruction label read, "Keep out of reach of children." This item was accessible to the children in care. This cabinet also contained two staff member's purses on a low shelf.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.	
(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.	

Findings:

General: Based on observation,

1.) The baseboard behind the rocking chair in the infant classroom was loosely attached to the wall. Additionally, there were several scuffmarks in this area.

2.) There were several areas with crayon marks on the walls in the three- to four-year-old classroom.

3.) There was chipping paint on the door by the dramatic play center in the two-year-old classroom.

In Compliance **Hygienic Practices First Aid/Medication** Not In Compliance 730 - Medication **Not In Compliance** 922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine. (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be: (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is: 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section; 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child; 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including: a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child; b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector; c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care; (b) Kept in the original bottle; and (c) Properly labeled. (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed. Findings: General: Based on observation, there was a bottle of teething tablets located in the one-year-old classroom; the bottle was not labeled with a child's name.

1200 - Posting Requirements

922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

(6) In addition to the posting requirement of KRS 199.898(3), a child-care center shall post the following in a conspicuous place and make available for public inspection:

(a) The provider's preliminary or regular license;

(b) Each statement of deficiency and civil penalty notice issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year;

- (c) Each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year;
- (d) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's Website as specified in KRS 199.897;

(e) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including:

1. Current rates for child care; and

2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;

(f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and

(g) Daily planned program.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, there was not a full day schedule for the school-aged classroom available for review. The posted schedule was for afterschool hours.

1215 - Daily Activities

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities. (1) A director shall:

(h) Post a schedule of daily activities, to include dates and times of activities to be conducted with the children in each classroom;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation,

1.) The lesson plan posted in the school-age classroom did not contain a date; the surveyor was unable to determine whether the document was current.

2.) The lesson plan in the one-year-old classroom was not current. The posted plan was dated July 20- July 24.
