(14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was determined that a staff person hired 1/11/2016 had evidence of only fourteen (14) hours of annual training on file for the last full year of employment. A review of ECE-TRIS records supports the information found during the survey. It was determined that a staff member hired on 08/21/2016 had evidence of only six (6) hours of annual training on file for the last year of employment and no documentation of Pediatric Head Abuse Trauma was contained in the employee's file.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, there was one child with a birthdate of 03/28/2014 that did not have a physician contact or a preferred hospital listed. There also was one child with a birthdate of 10/02/2014 that had "closest" listed for preferred hospital and did not have a hospital designated.
