- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
- 1. High school diploma:
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Documentation failed to reveal a high school diploma, GED or other qualifying documents from a comparable education entity for staff members with hire dates of: 3/7/17, 6/8/17, 10/24/16 and 8/22/16.

320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of staff files revealed a staff member with a hire date of 9/1/15 failed to have documentation verifying negative results from a tuberculin test, or a written statement from a health care professional stating the individual is free of tuberculosis.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of all staff files revealed staff members with a hire date of: 8/10/16, 9/1/15, and 4/4/16 failed to have documentation of completing the pediatric head trauma training within the first year of employment. Staff members with hire dates of 3/7/17, 10/24/16, 8/22/16 and 2/27/16 failed to have documentation verifying completion of cabinet approved orientation training within the first three months of employment. Staff members with hire dates of 9/1/15 and 8/15/14 failed to have documentation revealing 15 hours of cabinet approved training obtained during subsequent vears of employment.

- (d) That offers a variety of creative activities including the following:

- 2. Music:
- 3. Dramatic play:
- 4. Stories and books;
- 5. Science:

- 7. Tactile activity;
- 8. Culture;
- 9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. A review of documentation revealed out dated lesson plans posted in the Preschool room, and the Transition Room. A lesson plan was not available for review in the One Year Old room, providing a daily planned program of activities including art, blocks, music, dramatic play, science, stories and books, tactile activity, culture, indoor and outdoor play and a balance of active and quiet play, that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served.

435 - Bedding/Toys in Crib Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (a) For an infant:
- 3. No loose bedding; and
- 4. No toys or other items except the infant's pacifier;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation revealed a sleeping infant, in a crib, in the Infant room, covered in a loose blanket, with an additional loose blanket lying along side in the crib.

Premises Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;

460 - Inaccessible Items

- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed three (3) windows which had remaining broken shards of glass in the frames of the windows. The glass was accessible to the children while on the playground. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the windows had been broken by a recent hail storm.

 - b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
 - 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
 - 3. After toileting or diaper change;
 - 4. After handling animals;
 - 5. After wiping or blowing nose;
 - 6. After touching items soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
 - 7. After outdoor or indoor play time.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation in the One Year Old room revealed eight (8) children playing, and were then escorted to the table to eat without washing their hands.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with the regulatory requirements regarding medication. A review of a medication document failed to contain the name of the person who had administered each particular medication for all of the listed children.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (b) For a toddler or preschool-age child:
- 1. An individual bed, a two (2) inch thick waterproof mat, or cot in good repair; and
- 2. Bedding that is in good repair and is changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation in the Preschool, and in the Pre-K rooms, revealed numerous red and blue plastic mats which contained ripped seams, allowing the foam rubber to be visible and prevented the mats from being non-absorbent.

755 - Toys/Equipment/Furniture

- (1) All toys, equipment, and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. On the outside playground, a blue, two-seater car on springs, was observed to be missing both steering wheels, failing to provide a way for a child to hold on when bouncing. Additionally, the chain link fence had a coating of green paint which had excessive peeling and flaking.

- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's files in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of documentation failed to reveal a physician or physician contact number to enable a person in charge to contact the child's physician.
