Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Observation of room 7 revealed seventeen (17) children with one (1) staff member. Interview with the staff member revealed the youngest age child in care was five years old. Observation of room 10 revealed seventeen (17) children in care with one (1) staff member. Interview with the staff member revealed the youngest age child in care was five years old. Observation of room 5 revealed nine (9) children in care with one (1) staff member. Interview with the staff member revealed the youngest age child in care was one year old. Observation of room 6 revealed seven (7) children in care with one (1) staff member. Interview with the staff member revealed the youngest age child in care was one year old.

Review revealed five (5) files do not contain a staff evaluation. Interview with the director revealed an acknowledgement that there was not a staff evaluation in examples of the survey.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, review of documentation and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation of room 7 revealed a staff member with the hire date 7/10/18 was the sole caregiver for seventeen (17) children. Review of presented staff files revealed the file for the staff member with the hire date 7/10/18 did not contain a background check for review. Interview with the director revealed an acknowledgement that the background check was not presented for review.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request written documentation from a health care professional to verify that two (2) staff members with the hire dates 2/21/06 and 4/4/16 were free from active TB was not presented for review

410 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of presented staff files revealed two (2) staff members with the hire dates 1/26/18 and 3/5/18 did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within ninety (90) days of employment. Interview with the director revealed she could not verify that the orientation training for the two (2) aforementioned staff members had been completed.

Review of staff files revealed a staff member with the hire date 4/4/16 did not contain verification of completion of Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training.

(4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:
(a) Posted in writing in a conspicuous location with each age group and followed;
(b) Of activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served;
(c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and
(d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities
including the following:
1. Art or music;
2. Math or numbers;
3. Dramatic play;
4. Stories and books;
5. Science or nature;
6. Block building or stacking;
7. Tactile or sensory activity;
8. Multi-cultural exposure;
9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;
10. A balance of active and quiet play, including group and individual activity;
11. An opportunity for a child to:
a. Have some free choice of activities;
b. If desired, play apart from the group at times;
Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation of room 7 revealed there were no materials for science, art and dramatic play at the time of the survey. Upon request, a written daily planned program "lesson plan" was not presented for review for room 7 and room 10.

Premises

520 - Inaccessible Items

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of room 7 revealed glass cleaner located on a shelf accessible to children. Observation of room 10 revealed glass cleaner located on a shelf accessible to children. Review of the label on the aforementioned glass cleaners stated "Keep out of the reach of children."

540 - Premises Requirements

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(1) The premises shall be:

(a) Suitable for the purpose intended;

(b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of room 7 revealed brown carpet that was soiled. Continued observation of room 7 revealed the tile flooring was soiled with a substance that left a sticky residue on the bottom of the surveyor's shoes. Observation of room 10 revealed brown carpet that was soiled.

650 - Toilet

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(4) Each toilet shall:

(a) Be kept in clean condition;

- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and

(d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the bathroom located in room 3 revealed the toilet was not in working order, with a sign on it that read, "Do not use". Observation of the bathroom located in room 4 revealed the water in the toilet was continuously running after it was flushed. Observation of the bathroom located in room 10 revealed a yellow substance on the back of the toilet lid and on the toilet seat that was indicative of urine. Continued observation of the toilet located in the room 10 bathroom revealed the toilet bowl was soiled with a brown substance adhered to it.

Hygienic Practices

685 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements. (10) When a child is diapered, the child shall: (10) When a child is diapered, the child shall: (b) Be placed on a surface that is: 1. Clean; 2. Padded; 3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage; 4. Nonabsorbent; 5. Easily cleaned; and 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing. Findings: General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the changing area in room 6 revealed a torn changing pad exposing the inside absorbent material.

First Aid/Medication

715 - First Aid Supplies

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (1) First aid supplies shall:
- (a) Be available to provide prompt and proper first aid treatment;
- (b) Be stored out of reach of a child;
- (c) Be periodically inventoried to ensure the supplies have not expired;
- (d) If reusable, be:
- 1. Sanitized; and
- 2. Maintained in a sanitary manner; and
- (e) Include:
- 1. Liquid soap;
- 2. Adhesive bandages;
- 3. Sterile gauze;
- 4. Medical tape;
- 5. Scissors;
- 6. A thermometer;
- 7. Flashlight;
- 8. Cold pack;
- 9. First aid book;
- 10. Disposable gloves; and

11. A cardiopulmonary resuscitation mouthpiece protector.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with the regulatory requirements regarding first aid. Observation of the first aid supplies revealed the child care center did not have gauze, medical tape, a cold pack, first aid book, a cardiopulmonary resuscitation mouthpiece protector and a working flashlight. Interview with the director revealed the aforementioned first aid supplies were not presented at the time of the survey.
