- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver's cup half full of a liquid set on a desk. Two (2) caregiver's coats each hung over a chair. These items were accessible to children in the preschool room #2.

645 - Sink **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the hot water temperature registered eighty (80) degrees Fahrenheit at two (2) handwashing sinks in the preschool room #2.

- 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and

General: Based on review of documentation, the center's statement of deficiency and plan of correction during the current year were not posted.

922 KAR 2:410E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation the center failed to:

- 1). Assure all child care staff, directors, owners, and operators shall complete a new, mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the date of reopening, in accordance with 922KAR2:410E Section 9. Two (2) caregivers each hired 08/22/16, a caregiver hired 12/01/16, a caregiver hired 08/15/17, and a caregiver hired 10/09/18, did not have documentation of completing the mandatory training prior to the center reopening.
- 2). Assure all new staff hired shall take the mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting within ninety (90) days of their hire date, in accordance with 922KAR 2:405E Section 9. A caregiver hired 06/15/2020, did not have documentation of completing the mandatory training within ninety (90) days of hire.
- 3). Create and post a cleaning and sanitizing plan in specific to the individual child care center or family child care home and outline the addition cleaning and sanitizing requirements from the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention for the child care during the a pandemic, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:410E Section 6. The center did not post the cleaning and sanitizing plan.
- 4). Assure a child who is between three-years of age and first grade may wear a face mask if the provider and the parent or guardian complete the DCC-410, Child Care Face Mask Permission Form, to be kept on site at the facility. Surveyor observed a four-year child wore a face mask in the preschool room #5. Documentation and interview revealed the child did not have a DCC-410, Child Care Face Mask Permission Form completed and on site.
