General: Based on review of documentation, a staff member hired 12/12/16, had completed three out of fifteen hours of annual cabinet approved early care and education training for the 2017-2018 year of employment. A review of ECE-TRIS supports this finding.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. During a tour of the preschool playground, the surveyor observed one window screen that was broken.
- 2. Surveyor observed excessive build-up of dirt/grime on the carpet in several classrooms (Suite 450, Suite 400, Suite 350, and Suite 250).
- 3. Surveyor observed excessive tape residue on a half-wall in Suite 350 and on a wall under the children's cubbies in Suite 400.
- 4. Surveyor observed dark spots/stains on the floor tile near the children's bathrooms and several pieces of broken floor tile in Suite 350.
- 5. Surveyor observed excessive dried paint spills on the window sill and baseboard in Suite 450.
- 6. Surveyor observed a broken window blind above the science area in Suite 450.

The staff person in charge stated during the exit interview that they are currently getting estimates to replace the flooring throughout the entire building.

- (4) A child shall:
- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon his or her developmental skills;
- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a one-year-old child was not helped with personal care and cleanliness. While in Suite 250 the surveyor observed a female child with nasal discharge running towards her mouth and dried mucous on her cheeks. There were two staff observed present in the classroom with the children. Neither staff person assisted the child with personal care and cleanliness while the surveyor was in the classroom.

- (1) All toys and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. A wooden shelving unit positioned close to the preschool classroom entrance contained excessive tape residue on all shelf levels.
- 2. The top of a wooden shelving unit in Suite 450 contained an excessive amount of dried paint spills and glitter.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. A round area rug in the middle of Suite 450 contained numerous spots and stains.
- 2. A dramatic play kitchen set in Suite 300 contained an accumulation of dirt/grime build-up on the top surface. The plastic sink basin was being secured to the play set with clear tape. The tape was coming loose and curling up on the ends.
- 3. Surveyor observed torn vinyl on two child-size chairs in Suite 400. The foam filling was exposed on the sides of the chairs.
