(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. Suite 250 contained an area of carpet that was dirty and excessively worn in front of the diaper changing area.
- 2. Suite 350 contained a broken floor tile next to the bathroom stall door.
- 3. Suite 450 was missing a transition strip on the floor by the sinks. The transition strip was missing where the carpet transitions to the tile.
- 4. Suite 450 contained an owl carpet with numerous stains and spills on the surface.

645 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. Suite 350 contained a handwashing sink for the children and the hot water tap was not working; therefore, hot water is not accessible from the sink.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. A swing on the playground used by the older children contained sharp plastic that was coming off around the metal chain.
- 2. Suite 150 contained tape residue on five of the cribs. The tape residue was on the Plexiglass ends of the cribs.
- 3. Suite 150 contained tape residue on the wooden drawers next to the sink, under the diaper changing area.
- 4. The EDL 2 Room contained a broken piece of plywood (on the corner top hinge) on the children's refrigerator in the home living area.
- 5. The EDL 1 Room contained tape residue on the blue cabinets and some of the blue drawers.
- 6. Suite 300 contained a dirty stove top in the home living area.
- 7. Suite 300 contained a wooden gate that was in disrepair.
- 8. Suite 350 contained tape residue on the wooden shelf below the cubbies.
- 9. Suite 400 contained tape residue on the top of a table labeled "table toys".
- 10. Suite 450 contained tape residue on the wooden shelves in the home living area.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. Four children's files did not contain a preferred hospital listed in their enrollment information.
