General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. During the renewal survey a two-year-old child was wearing an amber teething necklace in Suite 300. The teething necklace is considered a choking hazard.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1. Eight staff members (12/13/2018, 7/29/2019, 10/20/2020, 11/2/2020, 7/26/2021, 8/9/2021, 8/18/2021, and 9/2/2021) did not have evidence of completing 15 hours of annual early care and education training on file in the facility. A review of ECE-TRIS records supports the information found during the survey.
- 2. Two staff members hired on 06/15/2020 and 11/2/2020, completed PAHT training on 12/11/2013 and 12/9/2013; however, they did not renew the training due 12/11/2018 and 12/9/2018. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed.
- 3. A staff member hired 5/17/2021, did not complete the required Orientation I and II courses. This staff member has been employed for more than three months. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The pre-k 1 room contained a section of trim around one of the lights in the ceiling that was not properly secured.
- 2. Suite 400 (3-year-old room) contained a broken section of transition strip that leads from the carpet to the tile floor.
- 3. Suite 350 (2-year-old room) contained sections of the tile flooring that were in disrepair near the bathroom and the changing table.
- 4. Suite 250 (18-24-months room) contained an area of carpet that was worn and dirty in front of the diaper changing area.

- (1) All toys and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. Suite 350 (2-year-old room) contained tape residue on a shelf below the shapes.
- 2. Suite 350 contained tape residue on the wall below the cubbies and window.
- 3. Suite 300 (2-year-old room) contained tape residue on a shelf containing dishes.
- 4. Suite 250 (18-24 month-old room) contained tape residue on a shelf containing puzzles.
- 5. Suite 250 contained tape residue on the yellow half-wall.
- 6. Suite 250 contained a section of torn yellow contact paper on the half-wall.
- 7. The older school-age room contained tape residue on a shelf that contained art materials.
- 8. The younger school-age room contained tape residue on the front of the blue storage cabinets and drawers.
- 9. Suite 150 (infant room) contained tape residue on the end of three of the plexiglass cribs.
- 10. Suite 200 (12-18 month-old room) contained tape residue on the end of a white shelf with blocks stored on it.
- 11. Suite 200 contained a shelf with a hole in the top section that was repaired by clear packing tape.
- 12. Suite 450 (3-4- year-old room) contained torn contact paper on the back of the dollhouse.
- 13. Suite 450 contained tape residue on a shelf with musical instruments stored on it, and a shelf with cars on it. The home living table in this room also contained tape residue on the top where a label had been relocated.
- 14. Suite 400 (3-year-old room) contained tape residue on a shelf with puzzles and shapes and a shelf with dolls on it.
