- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After wiping or blowing nose;
- 6. After touching items soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 7. After outdoor or indoor play time.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a two (2) year old boy did not wash his hands after he ate a snack.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the diaper changing station was not padded. The caregivers placed a paper material over the diapering surface prior to changing a

General: Based on observation, a two (2) year old boy placed his entire mouth around the handwashing faucet to drink water. The faucet was not sanitized prior to the child's use. after eight (8) children and a caregiver washed their hands.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the food service permit expired on 12/31/16.

1050 - Menu Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (16) A weekly menu shall be:
- (a) Prepared;
- (b) Dated;
- (c) Posted in advance in a conspicuous place;
- (d) Kept on file for thirty (30) days; and
- (e) Amended in writing with any substitutions on the day the meal is served.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and observation, eight (8) children were served a morning snack but the morning snack was not documented on the weekly menu. Interview with the caregiver determined the children were served a morning snack daily and she was not aware the morning snack was to be documented on the menu.

1060 - Snack Requirements

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (18) A snack shall include two (2) of the following:
- (a) Milk;
- (b) Protein;
- (c) Bread; or
- (d)1. Fruit;
- 2. Vegetable; or

General: Based on observation, eight (8) children, aged one (1) year to three (3) years old, were served a breakfast bar and water; therefore the snack componenets were not met.
