General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found a staff's (DOH: 11/14/17) file did not contain a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 $rac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE - TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- (1.) Staff (DOH: 3/6/17) obtained six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation on 6/9/17; therefore, the training was not obtained during the staff's first three (3) months of
- (2.) Staff (DOH: 10/14/15) obtained ten and one half (10 1/2) of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved early care and education training.
- (3.) Staff (DOH: 6/27/16) obtained ten and one half (10 1/2) of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved early care and education training.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found one (1) container of A + D Diaper Rash Creme in a low lying cubby beside the diaper changing table. The surveyor observed children walking inside the classroom and the creme was within reach of the children.

- (11) While bottle feeding an infant, the:
 - (a) Child shall be held; and
- (b) Bottle shall not be:

- 2. Left in the mouth of a sleeping infant; or
- 3. Heated in a microwave

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor observed one (1) infant bottle feeding herself in a walker inside the nursery. Staff was not aware that the child needed to be held while bottle feeding.

935 - Refrigerator Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.

- (4) A cold-storage facility used for storage of perishable food in a nonfrozen state shall:
- (a) Have an indicating thermometer or other appropriate temperature measuring device;
- (b) Be in a safe environment for preservation; and
- (c) Be forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the refrigerator located in the one's classroom contained multiple areas of a dried substance that needed to be cleaned on the shelves inside the refrigerator.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found there were six (6) children present inside the nursery with the arrival times of only two (2) children documented on the daily attendance record. Staff reported parents forget to sign the children in on the daily attendance record.
