Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor found no written daily activity plan (lesson plan) posted or made available in the Pre-K classroom. The staff person stated that she was a substitute and did not know where the lesson plan was located.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation.

1. Fifteen staff members did not complete the new mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the date of the facility reopening on 7/20/20. These staff members were hired on 3/26/15, 12/01/15, 4/02/18, 4/23/18, 10/18/17, 01/03/18, 01/07/1988, 4/17/17, 1/02/14, 3/21/14, 5/11/15, 12/13/17, 9/20/17, 2/07/19, and 7/16/18. The staff files and the ECE-TRIS system were reviewed.

2. Two staff in the Nursery 2 classroom did not wear gloves as they fed bottles to two infants.
