Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that one (1) staff person was supervising eleven (11) one-year-old and two-year-old children in the Two Year Old classroom. The staff person stated that she had been the only teacher in the classroom that morning. A review of the attendance records found that the classroom was out of ratio from 8:00 a.m. until a second staff person joined her at 8:55 a.m. In addition, at 9:45 a.m. the second staff person was observed to leave the classroom for one (1) minute, thus leaving a single staff person alone with the eleven (11) one-year-old and two-year-old children.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, staff hired on 09/23/97 had only twelve (12) hours of cabinet approved training on file. Staff hired on 04/24/14 has not completed the required Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma class. This information was verified through ECE-TRIS.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that an unlocked drawer in the kitchenette of the School Age building contained a screwdriver, a box cutter and empty plastic bags. An unlocked cabinet in this same kitchenette was found to contain Smart Sense disinfecting spray and multiple cans of spray paint, each of which bore the label, "Keep Out of Reach of Children." The children walk through this kitchenette to get to the classroom areas.

465 - Items Accessible Only During Activity

- (8) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care unless under direct supervision and part of planned program of instruction:
- (a) Knives and sharp objects;
- (b) Litter and rubbish; and
- (c) Plastic bags not used for personal belongings.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that empty plastic bags, a screwdriver and a box cutter were accessible to the children in the School Age building. These items were not being used as part of a scheduled activity.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child;

- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the expiration date on the bottle has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the medication box located in the Two Year Old classroom contained a can of Dermaplast pain relieving spray. This can was not labeled.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that all climbers, slides and swings located on both playgrounds were positioned on very sparse mulch, grass and dirt. These items included five (5) swings, four (4) climber/slide combination units ranging from two (2) to three (3) feet in height, multiple metal automobile-shaped climbers, an arch jungle gym, six (6) feet tall monkey bars, a wave/arch jungle gym and a seven (7) feet tall metal slide. The director stated that the facility had not had mulch since spring.

Equipment Not In Compliance

710 - Play Equipment Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (24) Supports for climbing apparatus and large equipment shall be securely fastened to the ground.
- (25) Crawl spaces, such as tunnels, shall be short and wide enough to permit access by adults.
- (26) A sandbox shall be:
- (a) Constructed to allow for drainage;
- (b) Covered when not in use;
- (c) Kept clean; and
- (d) Checked for vermin prior to use.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the arch monkey bars were not securely anchored to the ground.

755 - Toys/Equipment/Furniture

Not In Compliance

- 922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.
- (1) All toys, equipment, and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that six (6) bucket seats located in the Older Infants classroom did not have the manufacturer required safety straps installed. It was also found that seven (7) highchairs in the eating room did not have the manufacturer required safety straps installed. These seats were being used by the children during the survey.

Transportation Not In Compliance

820 - Vehicle Equipment Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Transportation.

- (4) A vehicle used to transport children shall be equipped with:
- (a) A fire extinguisher;
- (b) First aid supplies as described in Section 7 of this administrative regulation;
- (c) Emergency reflective triangles; and
- (d) A device to cut the restraint system, if necessary.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the fire extinguisher on the 2001 Chevy 3500 van was empty.

Food Service Not In Compliance

985 - Milk Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (3) A serving of milk shall consist of:
- (a) Breast milk or iron-fortified formula for a child age birth to twelve (12) months;
- (b) Pasteurized whole milk for children ages twelve (12) months to twenty-four (24) months; or
- (c) Pasteurized low fat one (1) percent or fat-free skim milk for children ages twenty-four (24) months to school-age.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the two-year-old children were served whole milk for breakfast. Children over two (2) years of age were being served 2% milk.
