(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment; (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2)

hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A review of staff records and ECE-Tris records found a staff person hired 3/1/2018, and a staff person hired 9/1/2017, did not have evidence of having completed 15 hours of cabinet-approved annual training.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. During a tour of the girls' bathroom, a containter of Clorox disinfectant wipes was found in an unlocked cabinet under the diaper changing table. The label on the container of disinfectant wipes indicated a warning to keep out of the reach of children. The container was accessible to the children.

Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's: (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment; (ii) Family physician; and (iii) Preferred hospital: c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child; d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable: (i) Allergies; (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center; e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child; f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence; Findings: General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A review of 10 children's enrollment information files found one child did not have a preferred hospital listed. On the line designated for information regarding a hospital preference, the word, "none," had been written instead of the name of a hospital. (6) In addition to the posting requirement of KRS 199.898(3), a child-care center shall post the following in a conspicuous place and make available for public inspection: (a) The provider's preliminary or regular license; (b) Each statement of deficiency and civil penalty notice issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year; (c) Each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year; (d) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's Website as specified in KRS 199.897; (e) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including: 1. Current rates for child care; and 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;

(f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and

(g) Daily planned program.
