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340 - Staff Meeting

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the director failed to conduct recurring staff meetings. The staff person in charge presented written verification of only one staff meeting conducted on 2/24/2020. It is important to note, this regulation was cited during a renewal inspection performed on 8/6/2019.

350 - Health, Safety, Comfort

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. Upon arrival at approximately 9:42 a.m., the surveyor noted that the kitchen door was propped open. It should be noted that one has to walk through the Pre-K classroom to gain access to the kitchen. Six children ages four- to five-years-old were present in the classroom; therefore, had access to the kitchen at the time of the observation.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found a staff person re-hired on 6/15/2020, did not have proof of education on file.

Findings:

Based on review of documentation and interview, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation.

The surveyor reviewed lesson plans posted in the Infant, Pre-school, and Pre-K classrooms, and found limited information. For example, only one to two activities were listed on the lesson plans such as, "shells", "paint", "outside", and "clean cubbies". Additionally, the lesson plan posted in the pre-k classroom was incomplete.

Due to the limited amount of information, it could not be determined if the activities met the individual needs and developmental levels of each child. The staff person in charge stated in previous years, the regional program manager had accepted the lesson plans during the summer months.

It is important to note, this regulation was cited during the renewal inspection completed on 8/6/2019.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation as follows:

- 1. The surveyor observed small clumps of dust hanging in the corners of the restroom located in the preschool classroom. Additionally, a section of black peeling tape and peeling drywall material was observed in the preschool classroom.
- 2. The surveyor observed water damage at the bottom of the hand-washing sink vanity unit in the two-year-old restroom.
- 3. The surveyor found peeling paint and caulking around the hand-washing sink located in the kitchen.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor found the restroom used by the children enrolled in the Pre-K classroom, dimly lit. The surveyor observed only one working light bulb in the light fixture above the hand-washing sink.

570 - Pest Control Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (7) Measures shall be utilized to control the presence of:
- (a) Rodents;
- (b) Flies;
- (c) Roaches; and
- (d) Other vermin.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor entered the infant classroom at approximately 9:50 a.m., and observed several gnats flying around a basket and the hand-washing sink. The staff person in charge stated that they have a pest control company to spray for mosquitos.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor found one water stained ceiling tile located in the Pre-K restroom.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor found excessive overgrowth of weeds and vines protruding through the fencerow. Additionally, there was standing water at the end of two slides.

755 - Protective Surface 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(21) A protective surface shall:

- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb:
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor found inadequate fall zone material (mulch) surrounding the climbing structures. The surveyor found the mulch sparse, and dirt exposed at the end of the slides. It is important to note, this regulation was cited during the renewal inspection completed on 8/6/2019.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor found seven bottles that were not individually labeled.

1075 - Bottle Preparation by Parent

(4) Formula or breast milk provided by the parent shall be prepared and labeled.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation. The surveyor observed a can of Good Start infant formula on a shelf in the infant classroom. The staff person informed the surveyor that she prepares a bottle for one child enrolled in her class. The surveyor found that the formula and water are not pre-measured by the parent prior to the staff person mixing the bottle.

1130 - Menu **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (16) A weekly menu shall be:
- (a) Prepared;
- (b) Dated;
- (c) Posted in advance in a conspicuous place;
- (d) Kept on file for thirty (30) days; and
- (e) Amended in writing with any substitutions on the day the meal is served.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the surveyor found an incomplete menu posted in the entryway of the child-care center. The staff person in charge acknowledged that the menu had not been completed for the last week of August, and stated that canned goods and other perishable items had just been delivered.
