A review of documentation failed to reveal evidence of employment eligibility in KARES or results of a Child Abuse/Neglect (CAN) check and Criminal Records Check (CRC) for a staff member with an unknown hire date. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the documentation was not available at the time of the survey. Observation revealed the staff member was not working alone with the children. Interview revealed the child was placed in the Two year old room as a form of discipline, after having attended in the 3/4 year old room, thereby failing to follow the emergency regulations regarding keeping children in the same group without interacting with children from another group throughout the day.
