General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, a caregiver supervised sixteen (16) children alone from 8:43 a.m. to 9:10 a.m., with a three-year-old being the youngest child in the preschool room.

A caregiver supervised nine (9) children alone from 8:15 a.m. to 10:17 a.m., with a one-year-old being the youngest in the two-year-old room.

A caregiver supervised seven (7) children alone from 8:40 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., with a one-year-old being the youngest in the toddler room; therefore, each of these classrooms did not maintain staff to child ratios.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a caregiver hired 01/24/22 supervised two (2) children who arrived at the center at approximately 6:00 a.m. on 07/12/22. The caregiver's first aid and CPR certification was current until 06/30/22. Interviews revealed the next caregiver who was currently certified first aid and CPR arrived at the center at approximately 8:35 a.m. Interview and review of documentation revealed thirty-four (34) children were present when the caregiver arrived who was currently certified in first aid and CPR; therefore, no one was present with current first aid and CPR certification for approximately two and half (2 1/2) hours on 07/12/22.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a caregiver hired 03/30/22 did not complete orientation training; therefore, she did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment.
