Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation during a tour of the childcare center on 3/11/19, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The daily planned program posted in the School-age Room was dated 2/19: therefore, the program was not current. Interview with staff found that school-age children attend the childcare center each afternoon.
- 2. The daily planned program posted in the Infant Room was dated 2/19; thus, the program was not current. The surveyor observed that seven (7) children were present in the classroom.

- 2. A child's (DOE: 3/10/18) enrollment information contained an immunization certificate that was no longer current as of 11/9/18. Through interview, the surveyor learned that an updated immunization certificate was not available.
