Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found one (1) staff person providing care for eleven (11) children in the Two Year Old Classroom. During interview, staff stated that the children were two-years-old; therefore, the classroom exceeded the staff-to-child ratio by one (1) child.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

- (11) A child shall not be subjected to:
- (a) Corporal physical discipline pursuant to KRS 199.896(18);
- (b) Loud, profane, threatening, frightening, humiliating, or abusive language; or
- (c) Discipline that is associated with:
- 1. Rest:
- 2. Toileting;
- 3. Play time; or
- 4. Food.

Findings:

General: Based on interview with staff, the surveyor learned that a one-year-old child was placed inside a highchair on approximately two (2) occasions by a staff person as a result of the child biting. Staff stated that when the one-year-old child had attempted to bite, staff have placed the child inside a highchair as a way to redirect the child's attention and remove the child from the situation. Although the staff stated that the highchair was not used as a form of discipline, by placing the child in the highchair directly after the child biting, it appeared that the child was subjected to discipline associated with food. Staff stated that the one-year-old child has multiple food allergies and staff have also assumed the child may be hungry when the child is trying to bite. Staff stated that staff have put the one-year-old child in a highchair, given the child a snack, and allowed the child to eat.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1.The surveyor found approximately nineteen (19) small cans of tomato soup stored underneath a cabinet in the lunch area that contained expiration dates of 7/14/21 and 02/24/21. During interview, staff stated that the tomato soup was served to the children on one (1) occasion when the soup was first bought and the children did not like it; therefore, staff stated that the tomato soup has not been served to the children again.
- 2. One (1) roll of hamburger meat that contained an expiration date of 11/14/21 and one (1) roll of hamburger meat that contained an expiration date of 11/25/21 located inside the freezer in the lunch area. During interview, staff stated that staff had not removed the hamburger meat from the freezer because it expired right before they closed for the Thanksgiving holiday. The hamburger meat was observed to be unopened.
