The surveyor entered the preschool classroom at 10:57am and noted that the children were watching an educational dvd on the television. The daily schedule stated that from 10:30am-11:00am it was Bible story time and crafts. There was no electronic viewing listed anywhere on the daily schedule or planned program for that classroom.
