Based on observation, the program of activities was not developed and posted in the one-year-olds' classroom.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a roll of black trash bags were in the last drawer and a roll of black trash bags were in the middle cabinet in the dining area in one-year-olds' classroom. A twelve-ounce (12 oz.) can of Mod Podge Acrylic Sealer was in a brown cabinet in two-year-olds' room. These items were accessible to children.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, an accumulation of dust was in the vents in the red and yellow restrooms. Food crumbs from breakfast served one and one half (1 ½) hours earlier covered the floors in the one-year-olds' room and the two-year-olds' room.

General: Based on observation, dust and brown spots were in the light fixture above the changing table in the nursery room.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, large black stains were on the carpeted floor in the school-age room. A square patch in the wall behind a shelf was pushed inward and created an opening along the top and bottom areas in school age room. Chipped paint was on the walls in the two-year-olds' restroom. An inch hole was in the lower wall on blue hallway and in the wall on the turquoise wall above the baseboard in the nursery. Three (3) brown spots were on the ceiling tiles in the nursery.

- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;

- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

General: Based on observation, the single handled sink knob came off when turned to dispense water in the red restroom.

General: Based on record review, four (4) children enrolled on 02/18/21, 03/12/19, 11/19/20 and 06/15/21 did not have an immunization certificate on file. A child enrolled on 12/14/20 had an immunization certificate on file that expired on 04/20/21. Also, a child enrolled on 01/01/21 had an immunization certificate on file that expired on 03/17/20.
