Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, an infant slept propped up on a Boppy pillow in a crib from 9:10 a.m. until 9:46 a.m. in the infants' room. A signed waiver from a health professional that indicated the infant required an alternate sleep position was not on file.

General: Based on observation, a large bottle of Lysol wipes was stored on a child's shelf located in the hallway beside the indoor play area. A bottle of hand sanitizer set on a desk in the preschool area. The Lysol wipes and hand sanitizer were labeled "Keep out of reach of children." A caregiver's cell phone was stored on a desk in the preschool room. All of these items were accessible to children.

625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a large brown stain covered a ceiling tile in the two-year-olds' room. Interview revealed there was a leak but the source of the leak was unknown

690 - Sink

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(3) A sink shall be:

(a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;

(b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;

(c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;

(d) Equipped with liquid soap;

(e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;

(f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and

(g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a handwashing sink was not immediately adjacent to the diaper changing mat that was propped beside a shelf in the one to two-yearolds' room. The closest handwashing sink was located down the hall behind a second door.

(c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a toddler child did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water before she ate a snack in the infants' room.

705 - Staff Hygiene/Handwashing

(5) Staff shall: (a) Maintain personal cleanliness; (b) Conform to hygienic practices while on duty; (c) Except as established in paragraph (d) of this subsection, wash their hands with liquid soap and running water: 1. Upon arrival at the center; 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting; 3. Before and after diapering each child; 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose; 5. After handling animals; 6. After caring for a sick child; 7. Before and after feeding a child or eating; 8. Before dispensing medication; 9. After smoking or vaping; and 10. If possible, before administering first aid; and (d) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. The staff shall wash the staff's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) caregivers' each did not wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water before they each fed an infant child in the infants' room.

A caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water before she fed a toddler child a snack in the infants' room.

A caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water after she wiped two (2) children's noses in the toddlers' room.

A caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water after she wiped a child's nose in the one to two-year-olds' room.

730 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.
(10) When a child is diapered, the child shall:
(b) Be placed on a surface that is:
1. Clean;
2. Padded;
3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage;
4. Nonabsorbent;
5. Easily cleaned; and
6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) tears were on top surface of a changing mat, which was propped against the wall beside the handwashing sink, in the toddlers' restroom.

Two (2) unpadded pull-down diaper changing tables each hung from the wall and had a hard surface in the two (2) restrooms located in the hallway. Two (2) toddler children were each diapered on the hard surface.

2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;

3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:

a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;

b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;

c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and

d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 13(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or

4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;

(b) Kept in the original bottle; and

(c) Properly labeled.

(7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.
