- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:
- a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) boys were unsupervised in a restroom located between the preschool and pre-k rooms. The restroom door was partially opened on the pre-k side and the surveyor observed the children in the restroom, for three (3) minutes, playing with their pants down. The responsible caregiver, hired on 9/17/18, was at the opposite end of the classroom preparing the children's plates for lunch. The children were not with the caregiver's scope of vision.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 1/27/16, had an evaluation on file dated March 2016 to March 2017. A caregiver hired on 2/15/16, had an evaluation on file dated 4/12/18, and three (3) caregivers, hired on 1/27/16, 11/8/16, and 2/1/16, each had an evaluation on file dated 2/1/18 to 2/28/19.

Findings

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 10/22/18, had no education documents on file.

395 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, three (3) caregivers, hired on 10/22/18, 9/17/18, and 3/20/19, did not have TB documentation on file.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) caregivers hired on 2/1/16 and 2/15/16, lacked three (3) hours of annual training. A caregiver hired on 1/27/16, lacked ten (10) hours of annual training. A caregiver hired on 1/8/16, lacked ten and a half (10 ½) hours of annual training. Also, a caregiver hired on 2/1/16, lacked six (6) hours of annual training.

Programming Not In Compliance

430 - Electronic Viewing/Listening Devices

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

- (4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:
- (d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities including the following:
- 12. Use of electronic viewing and listening devices if the:
- a. Material is appropriate to the child using the equipment;
- b. Material does not include any violence, adult content viewing, or inappropriate language;
- c. Viewing or individual listening is limited to two (2) hours per day;
- d. Viewing or listening is discussed with parents prior to viewing or listening; and
- e. Viewing or listening is designed as an educational tool.
- (5) A child who does not wish to use the electronic devices during the planned program shall be offered other appropriate activities.

Findinas

General: Based on observation, pop music was played in the toddler 1 room. The radio station was set on 96.5.

Premises Not In Compliance

520 - Inaccessible Items Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a brown purse, an open can of Sprite, and a bottle of Dr. Pepper were on a desk in the preschool room. These items were accessible to the children in care.

560 - Building Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:
- (a) Building is:
- 1. Dry;
- 2. Ventilated; and
- 3. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:
- a. In good repair in all areas; and
- b. Shielded or have shatter-proof bulbs installed; and
- (b) Following are protected:
- 1. Windows;
- 2. Doors;
- 3. Stoves;
- 4. Heaters:
- 5. Furnaces;
- 6. Pipes; and
- 7. Stairs.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a light fixture was not shielded and did not have a shatter proof bulb in the restroom between the toddler 2 room and the two-year-olds' room.

645 - Sink

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the hot water registered at sixty-three (63) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in the toddler 2 room.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings

General: Based on observation, a bottle of amoxicillin medication was not locked in a refrigerator in the infants' room. A tube of Desitin Rapid Relief Diaper Ointment, a pack of Nexium Oral Suspension, a tube of Aquaphor Healing Ointment, and a tube of Boudreaux's Butt Paste were all in the children's cubbies and not labeled to indicate to whom each belonged in the infants' room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was a sparse pea gravel and dirt underneath two (2) swings located in the outdoor play area.

(6) Cots, equipment, and furnishings used for sleeping and napping shall be spaced twelve (12) inches apart to allow free and safe movement by a person.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a crib was six (6) inches from one crib and nine (9) inches from another crib. A crib was placed against a wall and was eight (8) inches from another crib. A crib was placed nine and a half (9 ½) inches from another crib. These cribs were located in the infants' room.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the Plexiglas of two (2) cribs had smudges and smears in the toddler 1 room. Two (2) Graco highchairs did not have restraint belts in the toddler 1 room. These highchairs had a warning label which stated, "To prevent serious injury or death from falls or sliding out always secure child in the restraint." A child was placed in a Fisher Price highchair that did not have a restraint belt in the toddler 2 room. Also, a blue highchair had no restraint belt located in the infants' room. An Angeles Rider Tricycle was missing both foot pedals in the outdoor play area.

General: Based on observation, four (4) Dr. Brown's Bottles, one (1) blue whale-printed bottle, one (1) MAM bottle, one (1) cookie monster bottle, and one (1) Mickey Mouse bottle were not labeled to indicated to whom each belonged. This bottles were in a refrigerator in the toddler 1 room. In addition, one (1) Dr. Brown's Bottle was not covered in the toddler 1 room.

- (b) Each statement of deficiency and civil penalty notice issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year;
- (c) Each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year;
- (d) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's Website as specified in KRS 199.897;
- (e) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including:
- 1. Current rates for child care; and
- 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the posted statement of deficiencies and plan of corrections were dated 1/27/16 and 5/2/16. However, there was no current statement of deficiencies and plan of corrections posted for the current licensure year.

1215 - Daily Activities Not In Compliance

- (1) A director shall:
- (h) Post a schedule of daily activities, to include dates and times of activities to be conducted with the children in each classroom;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was no date on the posted schedule of daily activities in the toddler 2 room, two-year-olds' room, preschool room, and pre-K room.
