A staff person answered the door to let the surveyor inside at approximately 10:21 a.m. Upon seeing the surveyor, the staff person exited the area leaving only the gross motor room with fourteen (14) children ages eight (8) weeks to eight (8) years old. The staff person left the room over ratio and group size. After a brief moment, the staff person returned along with the staff person in charge. Findings:

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General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the director hired on 2/9/16 and a staff person hired on 3/5/18 did not complete fifteen (15) hours of early care and education training.



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430 - Electronic Viewing/Listening Devices

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:

(d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities including the following:

- 12. Use of electronic viewing and listening devices if the:
- a. Material is appropriate to the child using the equipment;
- b. Material does not include any violence, adult content viewing, or inappropriate language;
- c. Viewing or individual listening is limited to two (2) hours per day;
- d. Viewing or listening is discussed with parents prior to viewing or listening; and
- e. Viewing or listening is designed as an educational tool.

(5) A child who does not wish to use the electronic devices during the planned program shall be offered other appropriate activities.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, The child-care center failed to ensure electronic viewing material be age appropriate and utilized as an educational tool.

The surveyor entered the child-care center at approximately 10:21 a.m. and observed fourteen (14) children ages eight (8) weeks to eight (8) years old grouped together in the indoor gross motor room. The surveyor noted the lights were off and the non-animated Scooby-Doo movie was playing on the television. Some of the older children were sitting and watching the movie while the younger children were walking around the room. The staff person in charge stated they usually watch Super Why but the antenna was broken. The surveyor reviewed daily schedules and found Super Why listed for viewing at 10:30 a.m. However, the surveyor found electronic viewing not reflected on the daily lesson plans. It is important to note the Scooby-Doo movie has a rating of PG for parental guidance, which means some material may not be suitable for children. Additionally, Super Why is a preschool program geared for children ages three-to-six (3-6) years old. There was an infant, a toddler, four (4) two-year-old children, a four-year-old child, and seven (7) school-age children the oldest being eight (8) years old present at the time of the observation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a can of Lysol on a desk and disinfectant wipes on the wall ledge in the school-age classroom. Additionally, the surveyor found a bottle of Seventh Generation cleaning product on the back of the mop sink located in a restroom used by the children in care.

540 - Premises Requirements

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a bottle of cleaner, a toilet brush, a piece of wood, and a bouncy seat wrapped in plastic in a mop sink located in a restroom used by the children in care. The surveyor also observed a dirty washcloth on the floor next to the mop sink. Additionally, the surveyor found the infant classroom floor cluttered with several bouncy seat mobile attachments and a large plastic bag of stuffed animals. A staff person stated she recently cleaned the mobile attachments and had left them on the floor.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child-care center failed to meet this regulation.

The surveyor found Meijer brand diaper ointment and a container of Castor Oil on top of a small refrigerator positioned directly on the floor in the diapering/restroom area. It is important to note that children walk through this area to get to the restroom; therefore, these items were within reach of the children in care. It is unknown if the medication belonged to a child in care or belonged to the child-care center due to it not being labeled.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff person in charge stated the director started transporting an eight (8) week old infant to and from the child-care center on July 10. The surveyor found no written transportation schedule or documentation of the transportation route available for review.

915 - Pre-trip Inspection

(8) A daily inspection of the vehicle shall be performed prior to the vehicle's use and documented for:

(a) Tire inflation consistent with tire manufacturer's recommended air pressure;

(e) Cleanliness and good repair.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff person in charge stated the director started transporting an eight (8) week old infant to and from the child-care center on July 10. The surveyor found the pre-trip inspection of the vehicle was not completed.

960 - Children's Transportation Records

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff person in charge stated the director started transporting an eight (8) week old infant to and from the child-care center on July 10. The surveyor found the transportation document for recording the name of the child and the time on and off the vehicle not completed.

It is important to note, a child who is able to hold her own bottle should be seated in an appropriate furnishing such as a high chair. The surveyor found that this regulatory violation was cited during the renewal inspection conducted on 6/8/18.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, the surveyor found that the child-care center has lunch delivered from Distinctive Dining catering service. The director stated the food service permit from this establishment was expired.
