General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, no one employed was currently certified in infant/child and adult First aid.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a caregiver hired 02/24/16, completed thirteen (13) hours of the fifteen (15) hours of training required for the subsequent year of employment. A caregiver hired 04/12/16 did not complete the fifteen (15) hours of annual training required for the subsequent year of employment. Two (2) caregivers, hired 08/22/17 and 09/22/17, did not complete six (6) hours of orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment. One (1) caregiver hired 04/12/16, had not completed Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training.
