General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 08/18/19, had TB documentation on file that was dated 05/29/18. A caregiver hired 09/27/16, had TB documentation on file that was dated 05/01/18. A caregiver hired 02/24/16, had a TB documentation on file that was dated 04/30/18.

A caregiver hired 06/01/2021, a caregiver hired 04/12/2021, a caregiver hired 03/22/2021, and a caregiver hired 09/02/19, each did not have TB documentation on file.

(4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:

(a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and

(b) First aid.

(5) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid training shall be in addition to the fifteen (15) clock hours requirement in subsection (16) of this section.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, there was no one present who was currently certified to administer first aid and CPR from 6:30 a.m. until 5:30 a.m. daily since 05/31/2021.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

(17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 02/03/2021, did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training within the first three (3) months of employment.
