Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A staff member hired on 7/06/2018, did not have evidence of submission or results of an out-ofstate background check from Ohio. The staff person had a copy of an Ohio driver's license in her file; therefore, she would need a child abuse/neglect check and a sexual abuse registry check from this state as well. This staff member was not working alone during the survey.

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 13. Care Requirements for a Provider. (1) A provider shall ensure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The certified provider indicated that the children play outside on a concrete pad at the base of the driveway. A long set of wooden stairs were observed leading up to the deck next to the concrete area where the children play. These stairs were steep and unprotected at the bottom where the children play; this poses a safety risk to the children. It should be noted that the certified provider cares for one-year-old children.

(1)(a) Between July 1 and June 30 of the following calendar year, a provider shall complete at least nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training beginning with the second year of operation, including one and one-half (1½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training in accordance with KRS 199.8982(2) to be completed:

- 1. Within the second year of employment or operation in child care; and
- 2. Every subsequent five (5) years of employment or operation in child care.
- (b) A provider or assistant's compliance with the training in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subsection or subsection (8) of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designed database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The certified provider, hired on 8/10/2016, completed PAHT training on 4/12/2017; however, did not renew the training due on 4/12/2022. The ECE-TRIS system confirmed this findings.

- (8) An assistant used in excess of fourteen (14) calendar days during a one (1) year period shall demonstrate completion of at least nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved training between July 1 and June 30 of the following calendar year beginning the second year of employment, including:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved training in accordance with KRS 199.8982(2); and
- (b) Pediatric abusive head trauma training pursuant to KRS 199.8982(2), in accordance with subsection (1) of this section.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A staff member, that is the provider's assistant, only completed eight of the nine hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training between 7/01/2020 and 6/30/2021. This staff member was hired on 7/06/2018. Based on interview, the assistant works in excess of fourteen calendar days during a one year period. The ECE-TRIS system confirmed this finding.

- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable the provider to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the family child-care home;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the provider to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A child enrolled on 4/16/2022, did not have a file. The child was missing identifying information, an approved pick-up list, health information, an emergency contact list, a physician's name and phone number, a preferred hospital, and authorization for emergency medical care.
