Section 4. Premises Requirements. (20) An outdoor play area shall be: (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard; (e) Well drained; (f) Well maintained; (g) In good repair; and

(h) Visible to staff at all times.

## Findings:

General: Based on Observation, fabric weed block protruded above the mulch on the older toddlers' outside playground. This created a tripping hazard.
