## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) In the bathroom of the preschool room, there were areas of the baseboard that were missing and chipping paint.
- 2.) In the infant classroom, there were areas of missing paint on the walls in the room, as well as one large area of missing paint next to the cabinets hanging on the wall,
- 3.) In the bathroom of the infant classroom, there were areas of missing paint, areas on the wall with blue sticky tack, and holes in the wall.
- 4.) In the older school-age room located in the basement, there was a half wall that was missing paint. In addition, there was a hole in the wall of the girls' bathroom.
- 5.) In the yellow room, there were five small holes in the wall of the classroom.

- 1.) In the bathroom of the preschool room, the toilet lid was cracked and missing a piece of the lid. During the exit conference it was reported to the surveyor that a new toilet lid had been ordered.
- 2.) In the bathroom of the yellow classroom, there was a stain on the back of the toilet at the time of inspection.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found that there was a cabinet under the handwashing sink in the yellow room bathroom. This cabinet was in disrepair. There were areas where the wood was chipping and the surface was no longer smooth. In addition, the inside of the cabinet was stained from what appeared to be water damage.
