#### Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the childcare center, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. During a tour of Room #11, the surveyor found a drink from Hardees on top of the cubbies. Through interview, the surveyor learned that the drink belonged to a staff person.
- 2. During a tour of Room #17, the surveyor found that a pedestal fan, without a guard, was plugged into an electrical outlet within reach of the children. Through interview, the surveyor learned that the staff use the fan while children are present in the classroom.
- 3. During a tour of Room #1, the surveyor found an unsecured fan on the top of an approximate six (6) foot high shelf. Infants access the area in front of the shelf. If the fan falls from the shelf, it would create a safety risk for the children.

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. Verification of only seven and one-half (7 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training was found for a staff (DOH: 7/2/18).
- 2. Verification of only ten and one-half (10 ½) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training was found for a staff (DOH: 10/2/17).

General: Based on observation during a tour of the kitchen, the surveyor found that a large box containing individual packets of Cheerios was on the floor located near the doorway. Food must be stored a minimum of six (6) inches off the floor.
