General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Observation in the Toddler Room on 4/9/19 from 11:00am until 11:15am revealed one staff member had supervisory authority over ten (10) one-year-old children; therefore, the center failed to maintain minimum staff to child ratios during this time. Interview with director revealed she acknowledged the deficiency.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation in the Infant Room on 4/9/19 revealed an infant lying in a crib, drinking a bottle without being held.

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of children's files on 4/11/19 revealed a child with enrollment date 8/13/18 failed to contain authorization by the parent for the child care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence. Interview with the director revealed she needed to obtain this information from the parent.
