922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

(1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:

(n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in Section 3(1)(e)6 of this administrative regulation;

# Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that three (3) staff persons were working together caring for seventeen (17) children but none of the three (3) staff had a child abuse and neglect check on file. The dates of hire for the staff were 09/25/2017, 09/15/2017 and 08/2017.

## 300 - Background checks/left alone

922 KAR 2:090. Section 6. License Issuance.

(5) An individual described in subsection (4) of this section shall:

- (a) Submit to background checks described in paragraph (b) of this subsection;
- (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

# Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that three (3) staff persons were working together caring for seventeen (17) children but none of the three (3) staff had a child abuse and neglect check on file. The dates of hire for the staff were 09/25/2017, 09/15/2017 and 08/2017. It was also found that the staff person with a hire date of 08/2017 did not have documentation of a criminal records check in her file.



#### 315 - Educational Requirements

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
- 1. High school diploma:
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that a staff person with a hire date of 08/2017 did not have documentation of proof of education on file.

# 320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

# 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found through a review of eight (8) staff files that one (1) staff with a hire date of 08/2017 had no evidence of being free of TB.

# 340 - Training Not In Compliance

# 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found through a review of eight (8) staff files that one (1) staff person with a hire date of 04/04/2016 did not have evidence of the fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this. It was also found that a staff person with a hire date of 08/03/2006 did not have evidence of the renewal of their pediatric abusive head trauma training. A review of ECE-TRIS also confirmed this.

- (d) That offers a variety of creative activities including the following:
- 1. Art;
- 2. Music;
- 3. Dramatic play;
- 4. Stories and books;
- 5. Science:
- 6. Block building;
- 7. Tactile activity;
- 8. Culture;
- 9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that a child with an enrollment date of 08/16/2017 had a file that did not contain an immunization certificate.

- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found through a review of ten (10) children's files that one (1) child's file with a enrollment date of 08/16/2017 did not have the physician's contact information or the preferred hospital listed.
