(1) Child-care center staff:

390 - Educational Requirements

- (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
- 1. High school diploma:
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

# Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the files for staff members with hire dates of 2/11/20 and 2/12/20 did not contain a high school diploma, GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or Commonwealth Child Care Credential. Additionally, the file for a staff member, who is a high school student with a hire date of 10/23/19, did not contain verfication that the staff member is currently enrolled in high school. Interview with the staff member in charge revealed that the documentation was not available at the time of the inspection.

## 400 - CPR/First Aid Coverage Not In Compliance

## 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Infant and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) Infant and child first aid.
- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) First aid.

#### Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, only one staff member at the center is currently certified in First Ald and CPR. Interview with the staff member in charge revealed that the aforementioned staff member is not always present at the center during business hours; therefore, there are times when no staff member present at the center is certified in First Aid and CPR.

## 410 - Training Not In Compliance

## 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the files for staff members with hire dates of 6/10/19, 7/1/19, and 10/23/19 did not contain verification that the staff members received six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of their employment. The files for staff members with hire dates 4/4/18 and 6/12/18 did not contain verification that the staff member completed fifteen (15) annual hours of cabinet approved early care and education training. The file for a staff member with a hire date of 6/12/18 did not contain verification that the staff member had completed one and one half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training within the last five (5) years. Interview with the staff member in charge revealed that the documentation was not available at the time of the inspection. Review of ECE-Tris records failed fo verify completion of the aforementioned trainings.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the water temperature in all of six sinks in the center exceeded 120 degrees.

- (4) A child shall:
- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon his or her developmental skills;
- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation of the Nemo Room, a child's hands were not washed with soap and warm running water after his/her diaper was changed.

General: Based on observation of the playground revealed the protective surface did not sufficiently cover the ground under a two slides.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation of the Cat in the Hat Room, the cover of a florescent light hung off of the fixture on one side, indicating that it was not securely attached. Another florescent light in the Cat in the Hat Room flickered continuously, indicating that it was not functiong properly.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

#### Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the enrollment record for a child enrolled 1/7/19 was not signed by a parent and did not contain authorization by the parent for the provider to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence, or the name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child. The enrollment record for a child enrolled 11/4/19 did not contain a family physician and preferred hospital, or the name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child.
