General: Based on observation, the surveyor observed an infant child sleeping with a blanket in the infant classroom; this sleeping arrangement poses a suffocation hazard.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the infant classroom, the surveyor observed a small tube of oral pain reliever. The pain reliever was not labeled with a child's name.

Outdoor Play Area Not In Compliance

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, there were several bags of sand located on the playground. The staff person on the playground at the time of the survey indicated that the bags of sand were for a project to assist with proper drainage and had been left on the playground by the person completing this project. Additionally, the fence line of the playground had accumulated rubbish such as cans, bottles, and other discarded items.

General: Based on observation, there was a loose metal bar located on a railroad tie that bordered the playground. The metal bar poses a safety hazard.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (b) For a toddler or preschool-age child:
- 1. An individual bed, a two (2) inch thick waterproof mat, or cot in good repair; and
- 2. Bedding that is in good repair and is changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there were two cots stored in the preschool classroom that had frayed edges and were in disrepair.

810 - Individual Bedding Storage

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

(9) Individual bedding shall be stored in a sanitary manner.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the individual bedding for the preschool classroom was stored in a cloth divider. Some of the bedding was protruding from the divider and touching. This method of storage promotes cross-contamination of germs.

815 - Toys/Furniture

- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation:

- 1. A chalkboard and a large pink bus toy had been marked on with a crayon and marker in the preschool classroom.
- 2. The infant room contained a shelf with an excessive amount of tape residue. The tape residue had accumulated dirt and grime.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, two large containers of formula were observed stored in a cubby in the infant classroom. The surveyor asked the staff member in this classroom how bottles are prepared. The staff member stated that the infant teacher will measure the formula from the original container and will measure the water into the bottle. The bottles were not pre-measured at home. The facility does not supply their own formula for the infants enrolled.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the statement of deficiency and plan of correction from the 2019 year were not posted nor available for public review.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a football shaped storage-bin in the preschool classroom contained cloth dress toys and dolls; these items were accessible to the children and may contribute to the cross-contamination of germs.
