Findings:

410 - Training

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A beeping smoke detector was heard in the basement. This usually indicates a low battery or a malfunction of the device. The beeping appeared to be coming from the School-Age Room.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A substitute staff hired on 3/09/2020, did not have written evidence of completing the six hour cabinet-approved orientation training within the first three months of employment. The same staff did not complete the 1.50 hour cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training once every five years. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The hall bathroom near the Infant Room contained a dusty vent over the toilet.
- 2. The hall bathroom near the Infant Room contained a floor vent next to the toilet that contained an area of chipped paint. The area that was exposed contained rust.
- 3. A vent on the wall in the stairwell that leads to the basement was broken and appeared dirty.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The blue wall next to the refrigerator in the Infant Room contianed two areas of chipped/ scratched paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The back fence line on the playground was overgrown with weeds and brush. The weeds and brush were coming through the chain link fence in the outdoor play area.
- 2. The outdoor carpet on the concrete step that leads from the kitchen to the outdoor play area was not attached properly and posed a tripping hazard.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The refrigerator in the Infant Room contained tape residue on the surface.
- 2. The Preschool Room contained a broken hinge on the bottom of the door on the play kitchen set located in the home living area.
- 3. The 2 Year-old Room contained an area of chipped paint on the shelf holding the TV. The particleboard was exposed on the shelving unit.

- 2. A staff member hired on 12/28/2020, did not complete the ECE 202 Requirements for Reopening Child Care in Kentucky. The ECE-TRIS system was reviewed.
