- (1) To initiate the process for obtaining background checks on a prospective child care staff member, the child care provider shall:
- (a) Request that the prospective child care staff member provide a copy of his or her driver's license or other government-issued photo identification and verify that the photograph clearly matches the prospective child care staff member;
- (b) Request that the prospective child care staff member complete and sign the:
- 1. DCC-500, Applicant Child Care Staff Member Waiver Agreement and Statement; and
- 2. DCC-501, Disclosures to Be Provided to and Signed by the Applicant Child Care Staff Member; and
- (c) Log on to the NBCP portal and enter the prospective child care staff member's demographic information for a check of the:
- 1. Child abuse and neglect central registry pursuant to 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. National Crime Information Center's National Sex Offender Registry in accordance with 34 U.S.C. 20921; and
- 3. Sex Offender Registry established in accordance with KRS 17.500 through 17.580.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 3/23/21, did not have a name-based child abuse/neglect check and a criminal records check on file.

(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child will be:

- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:
- a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver hired on 9/8/19, left seven (7) children unsupervised when she stepped out of the infants' room and went to the door of the two and three-year-olds' room. Interview determined the caregiver stepped out of the room to inform the other caregivers the surveyor was at the center. The children were unsupervised for less than approximately ten (10) seconds.

General: Based on observation, a caregiver cared for seven (7) children alone from 9:55 a.m. to 10:25 a.m. in the infants' room. The youngest child was two-months-old.

(2) Except for a violation posing an immediate threat as handled in accordance with KRS 199.896(5)(c), a child-care center shall submit a written corrective action plan to the cabinet or its designee within fifteen (15) calendar days of the date of the statement of deficiency to eliminate or correct the regulatory violation.

Findings:

A PLAN OF CORRECTION WAS DUE ON 07/10/2021 AND AS OF 07/14/2021, THE PLAN OF CORRECTION HAS NOT BEEN RECEIVED.

210 - Licensee Responsibility

922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

- (1) A licensee shall:
- (a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and
- (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a parent entered the center at 10:24 a.m., a second parent entered at 11:36 a.m., a third parent entered at 12:04 p.m., a fourth parent entered at 12:08 p.m., a fifth parent entered at 1:11 p.m., and a sixth parent entered at 1:33 p.m., and each did not wear a face mask. In addition, a food deliverer took food inside the infants' room and did not wear a face mask at 12:30 p.m.

A ten and a half (10 ½) inch step down was between the back porch to the outdoor play area ground. This created a hazard for children when this route was used to enter the outdoor play area.

290 - Fire Marshal/Zoning Compliance

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, forty-four (44) children were present at the center. A review of the Fire Marshal's inspection report determined the center's approved capacity was forty (40) children. Therefore, the center was not in compliance with the Fire Marshal's recommended capacity. In addition, after review of the drills participation log, forty-three (43) children were present on 4/7/21, forty-seven (47) children were present on 2/10/21, and forty-four (44) children were present on 1/5/21.

Findings

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) caregivers hired on 3/23/21 and 9/17/18, did not have documentation of education on file.

395 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) caregivers hired on 3/23/21 and 9/17/18, did not have a TB documentation on file. Also, a caregiver hired on 2/7/17, had a TB documentation on file dated 5/31/19.

405 - Adequate Substitute(s)

Findings:

General: Based on interview, the center had only one (1) qualified substitute staff person available in case of need.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 9/8/19, did not completed six (6) hours of orientation.

- b. If desired, play apart from the group at times;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was no daily planned program of activities developed in the infants' room.

485 - Infant Sleep Position Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

(1) An infant shall sleep or nap on the infant's back unless the infant's health professional signs a waiver that states the infant requires an alternate sleeping position.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, an eleven-month-old child slept on a boppy pillow in a crib in the infants' room. The child did not have a signed waiver from a health professional to indicate the child required an alternate sleep position.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a twenty-seven (27) inch long area of rubber baseboard was not adhered to the wall near the window in the one-year-olds' room. An accumulation of dust was on a ceiling vent above the refrigerator in the infants' room. Also, an accumulation of dust was on a ceiling vent near the camera in the foyer.

625 - Infant/Toddler Indoor Space

Findings:

650 - Toilet

General: Based on observation, the preschool age and two and three-year-old children walked through the infants' room to utilize a restroom. Interview determined the restroom the children regularly used was inoperable.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(4) Each toilet shall:

- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a toilet had not been flushed after usage in a restroom near the two and three-year-olds' room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, black fabric weed block was above mulch under the Little Tikes Climber in the outdoor play area.

- (21) A protective surface shall:
- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb:
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and

General: Based on observation, sparse mulch was under a Little Tikes Climber in the outdoor play area. A yellow/blue slide was placed on dirt and a thin layer of mulch in the outdoor play area.

General: Based on observation, an uncovered bottle was not in use in two (2) separate cribs in the infants' room. A Lansinoh breastmilk storage bag was in the refrigerator and not labeled to indicate whom it belonged to in the infants' room.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the center's written evacuation plan was not updated each year in accordance with KRS 199.895. The evacuation plan was last updated on 2/1/17.

- (f) A written annual plan for child-care staff professional development;

Findings

General: Based on review of documentation, six (6) caregivers hired on 9/17/18, 7/17/19, 9/12/17, 9/8/19, 6/13/17, and 2/7/17, did not have an annual professional development plan on file.

General: Based on observation, the center's current regular license was not posted.

(1) A director shall:

(h) Post a schedule of daily activities, to include dates and times of activities to be conducted with the children in each classroom;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the posted schedule of daily activities was not dated and only showed activities from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. in the preschool room. There was no date on the posted schedule of daily activities in the two and three-year-olds' room, one-year-olds' room, and infants' room.
