(8) To qualify for a preliminary license, or maintain a regular license, a child-care center shall:(b) Be approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshal or designee;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, compliance with the State Fire Marshal's office was not verified. During the survey, it was found there was no current Fire Marshal inspection. The documentation presented for review at the time of the survey was dated from 2015.

160 - Liability Insurance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 6. License Issuance.

(8) To qualify for a preliminary license, or maintain a regular license, a child-care center shall:

(d) Provide written proof of liability insurance coverage of at least \$100,000 per occurrence;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements. Review of documentation found proof of current liability insurance was presented for review at the time of survey; however, verification of the coverage amount was not presented for review. Interview with staff-in-charge revealed she could not locate this documentation at the time of survey.

225 - Licensee Responsibility

922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

(1) A licensee shall:

(a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the health, safety, and comfort of children. It was found during the survey that two (2) electrical wall outlets, located directly underneath a table in the far back left corner of the main room, were uncovered and accessible to children.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Review of documentation found that a current copy of administrative regulations 922 KAR 2:090 and 922 KAR 2:280 were not presented for review at the time of survey.

360 - Staff Evaluation

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

(1) A director shall:

(j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain staff files in accordance with state regulations. Review of staff files found two employees with date of hire 6/15/2016, and 3/3/2021 were missing evaluations. Interview with the director found the documents were not available for review at the time of survey.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files found that a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential was not presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member hired 6/15/2016. Interview with the director revealed she needed to obtain proof of education for this staff member.

405 - TB Verification

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files found that a statement from a health professional that the individual with date of hire 6/15/2016, is free of active tuberculosis or a copy of negative tuberculin results was not presented for review at the time of survey.

435 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain staff records in accordance with state regulations. During the inspection, it was found that staff member hired 08/17/2016, had zero (0) training hours in the Early Care and Education Training Records Information System database.
