General: Based on a review of staff files and ECE-TRIS records, a staff person hired 1/28/2019, did not complete the required 6 hours of cabinet approved Orientation I and II training until 10/19/2019. This training is required to be completed within the first three months of employment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the Three- to Four-Year-Old Room, there were two child-sized, black and white checked, cloth covered chairs located under the window in the classroom. The cloth surface had several areas that were soiled and stained.

- (d)1. Two (2) vegetables;
- 2. Two (2) fruits; or
- 3. One (1) fruit and one (1) vegetable.

Findings:

General: Based on interview with the staff person in charge, it was found that the children's lunches are catered. At the time of the survey, lunch was observed by the surveyor in the Two- to Three-Year-Old Room. At that time, two of the six children in the room were observed eating a lunch that had been prepared at home and brought to the facility. One child was observed eating chicken nuggets, mandarin oranges and strawberries with water to drink. The other child had tortilla chips, mandarin oranges and a nut butter and jelly sandwich with milk to drink. This regulation requires that lunch includes milk, protein, bread, two vegetables, two fruits or a fruit and a vegetable. Neither of the children had their meal supplemented for those components missing from their lunch.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that the enrollment application contains language that indicates in the event of an emergency, the child will be transported to the nearest hospital. However, a line is also provided for the parent of the child to put down a preferred hospital. A review of an enrollment application of a child enrolled revealed the word "any" had been written on the line designated for the name of a preferred hospital.

Findings:

General: Based on a review of documentation, it was found that a form that was labeled for quarterly earthquake and tornado drills had a date and time noted but there was no indication as to what drill was conducted on that date and at that time. The quarterly earthquake and tornado drills are required to be conducted and recorded separately.
