General: Based on review of documentation, a staff file (DOH: 10/09/17) did not contain documentation of education.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that the two (2) persons identified as substitutes do not meet the staff requirements of this administrative regulation for a Type 1 center based on lack of cabinet-approved early care and education annual training hours.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

A review of the staff member's file and a review of ECE-TRIS found no additional PAHT training; therefore, the PAHT training is not being completed every five (5) years.
- 2. A staff member (DOH: 02/06/17) last completed the one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training on 02/21/13. A review of the staff member's file and a review of ECE-TRIS found no additional PAHT training; therefore, the PAHT training is not being completed every five (5) years.
- 3. A staff member (DOH: 02/22/17) last completed the one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training on 02/21/13. A review of the staff member's file and a review of ECE-TRIS found no additional PAHT training; therefore, the PAHT training is not being completed every five (5) years.
