#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, three (3) staff members did not have any proof in their respective files that pediatric abusive head trauma (PAHT) training was completed. The hire dates for the referenced staff members are: 04/16/2018, 06/12/2019, and 04/30/2019. In addition, three staff members did not have proof in their respective files that orientation training was completed. The hire dates for those staff members are: 06/12/2019, 12/06/2019, and 04/30/2019.

- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
  - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation in the classroom known as the Nimo room, there were two (2) tubes of diaper rash ointment and (1) tube of petroleum jelly on a shelf, which were accessible to children. In addition, the staff-in-charge disclosed that the three (3) children to which the tubes of ointment belonged to are no longer enrolled at the child care center.

- (c) Each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year;
- (d) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's Website as specified in KRS 199.897;
- (e) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including:
- 1. Current rates for child care; and
- 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and
- (g) Daily planned program.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, upon arrival, a child who was indentified as school-aged was initially grouped with the children in the classroom known as the Nimo room, which is comprised of children between three-years-of-age and four-years-of-age. Shortly thereafter, the school-aged child moved to the classroom known as the School-Aged room. Therefore, the center failed to assure compliance with the regulations specific to the current pandemic, as established in 922 KAR 2:405e, in regards to maintaining children in the same group once the group is established for the day.
