A caregiver hired on 2/25/18, did not have documentation of completing one and a half (1 1/2) hours of Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma Training (PHAT).

General: Based on review of documentation, a child start date 11/5/18, a child start date 8/5/19, and two (2) children start dates 8/10/20, did not have authorization, on file, by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence. Also, a child start date 1/21/20, did not have information on file for staff to contact the child's preferred hospital.

General: Based on observation, and review of documentation, the center failed to assure:

1.) All child care staff, directors, owners and operators completed a new, mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the opening date in accordance with 922 KAR:410 Section 9 (1). A caregiver hired on 10/14/19, a caregiver hired on 7/1/19, a caregiver hired on 8/10/17 and a caregiver hired on 2/18/20, did not complete the mandatory training.

2.) New staff shall undergo name-based background in accordance with 922 KAR 2:280 and shall not be left alone with children until name-based background checks have been approved and returned in accordance with 922 KAR 2:410E Section 11(5). A caregiver hired 2/18/20, did not have documentation to verify background checks had been submitted.
