Observation in the Preschool Bear Care room revealed staff members' purses and backpacks sitting on the floor and desks allowing accessibility to the 9 children ranging in age from 3 years to 5 years attending in the classroom. Personal belongings were also observed accessible to the 4 children in the Under 8 Bear Care room. Interview revealed the children in the Under 8 Bear Care room ranged in age from 7 years to 9 years.
