Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. During a tour of the infant room a three-month-old infant was observed sleeping in a bassinet style bed that was shaped in a V. A thick blanket had been used to cover up the child. A six-week-old infant was also observed in a similar style bed that was motorized and provided a rocking motion. A thick blanket had also been used to cover up the infant.

- 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. During a tour of the infant room a three-month-old infant was observed sleeping in a bassinet style bed that was shaped in a V. A six-week-old infant was also observed in a similar style bed that was motorized and provided a rocking motion. Neither of these beds had a firm mattress. An interview with the staff in the room found that the infants had been asleep in these beds for approximately one and one-half (1 1/2) hours. An interview with the director found that the foster parents of the six-week-old had been informed that the infant is required by a doctor to sleep in this particualr type of bed due to acid reflux. However, there was no documentation on file at the time of the visit on 3/12/19. In addition there was no documentation on file to verify that the three-month-old infant is required to sleep in a bed other than a crib with a firm mattress.
