General: Based on review of documentation, one staff hired on 1/30/2020, did not have evidence of a negative TB test or physician's statement on file at the facility.

435 - Training **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 $^{1\!2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, one staff hired on 1/11/18, did not have evidence of the required 15 hours of annual training. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this.

- (3) Rest time shall occur in an adequate space according to the child's age as follows:

- 3. No bedding other than a clean tight-fitted sheet; and
- 4. No toys or other items except the infant's pacifier;

General: Based on observation, it was found that two infants were placed in their cribs covered with blankets. The other cribs had folded up blankets in the cribs as well. Blankets are not to be used in cribs with infants.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was an area of cracked tile on the fireplace located in the infant room exposing sharp edges. In the One's classroom there was two cracks found in the linoleum. In addition, there was a crack in the doorframe located in the Two's classroom.

690 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found the sink in the girl's bathroom used by the Three's classroom was not draining well.


