390 - Educational Requirements

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
- 1. High school diploma:
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files revealed a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential was not presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member hired 5/14/18. Interview with owner revealed she needed to obtain proof of education for this staff member.

395 - TB Verification **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- . A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files revealed one (1) staff member hired 7/5/18 failed to have records of a negative tuberculin result or a statement from a health professional on file. Interview with owner revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090, Section 11, Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files and ECE-TRIS report revealed documentation of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training was not presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member hired 8/16/17. Continued review of staff files revealed one (1) staff member with a hire date of 8/16/17 had not completed state approved orientation training. Interview with owner revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

480 - Infant/Toddler Combined with Older Children

922 KAR 2:120. Section 5. Infant and Toddler Play Requirements.

- (2) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section or Section 2(2)(c) of this administrative regulation, an infant or toddler under twenty-four (24) months of age shall not participate in an activity with an older child for no more than one (1) hour per day.
- (3) If a toddler is developmentally appropriate for a transition to a preschool age group, a toddler may participate in an activity with an older child for more than one (1) hour per day if:
- (a) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;
- (b) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child;
- (c) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with either age group; and
- (d) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, review of documentation and interview, the center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation of the Three's Room on 9/12/18 revealed a two-year-old child participated in activities with children up to four-years-old from 8:30am-12:30pm. Review of documentation revealed the absence of a transition plan for the toddler. Interview with owner revealed a transition plan for the toddler was not available for review at the time of survey.

495 - Bedding/Toys in Crib Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (a) For an infant:

520 - Inaccessible Items

- 3. No loose bedding, such as a bumper or a blanket; and
- 4. No toys or other items except the infant's pacifier;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation of the Infant Room revealed two (2) infants sleeping in cribs with pacifier clips.

Premises

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

(7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:

- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. Observation of Three's Room revealed several plastic bags located in an unlocked cabinet under the sink that were accessible to children in care. Continued observation revealed in the Transition Room a staff member's purse was on the floor and accessible to children in the classroom.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of Infant Room revealed two classroom lights were not working. Observation in the Two's Room revealed several areas where paint was chipping and peeling from the walls and door. Continued observation revealed in the Transition Room several areas where paint was chipping from the classroom walls. Observation of the center hallway revealed several floor tiles and sections of baseboard were missing. Continued observation revealed in the Walkers Room paint was chipping from the walls in the classroom and a there was a hole in the wall of the classroom bathroom.



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650 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. Observation of the Transitional One's bathroom revealed the bathroom light was not operational. Continued observation revealed in the Walkers bathroom the toilet had a visible ring around the inside and would not flush. Interview with the owner revealed the water supply to the toilet was turned off.

Hygienic Practices

Not In Compliance

655 - Child Personal Care/Handwashing

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (4) A child shall:
- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon his or her developmental skills;
- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulations. Observation of the Two's Room revealed a child's hands were not washed after a diaper change.

660 - Staff Hygiene/Handwashing

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (5) Staff shall:
- (a) Maintain personal cleanliness;
- (b) Conform to hygienic practices while on duty;
- (c) Except as established in paragraph (d) of this subsection, wash their hands with liquid soap and running water:
- 1. Upon arrival at the center;
- 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;
- 3. Before and after diapering each child;
- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;
- 5. After handling animals:
- 6. After caring for a sick child;
- 7. Before and after feeding a child or eating;
- 8. Before dispensing medication;
- 9. After smoking or vaping; and
- 10. If possible, before administering first aid; and
- (d) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. The staff shall wash the staff's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulations. Observation of the Two's Room revealed a staff member changed a child's diaper, then touched other children and several items in the classroom, but did not wash her hands with liquid soap and running water after the diaper change.

685 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (10) When a child is diapered, the child shall:
- (b) Be placed on a surface that is:
- 1. Clean;
- 2. Padded;
- 3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage;
- 4. Nonabsorbent;
- 5. Easily cleaned; and
- 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain hygienic practices in accordance with regulations. Observation of the Two's Room revealed the diaperchanging pad was torn, exposing the inner padding.

- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:

- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulations. Observation of the outdoor play area revealed very visible, circular spots of dirt at the bottom of the yellow slide and below the yellow and green swings; therefore, the protective surface at the bottom of the slide and below the swings failed to sufficiently cover the ground. During interview, the owner acknowledged the protective surface at the bottom of the slide and swings failed to sufficiently cover the ground.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly: or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulations. Observation of Crawler Room revealed two (2) white crib sheets covered with smears of brown matter and several circular brown stains

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. Review of a children's files on 9/12/18 revealed a child with enrollment date 6/18/18 had an immunization certificate that expired on 8/1/18.

1140 - Enrollment Information **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. Review of ten (10) children's files revealed the written records for two (2) children enrolled 8/21/17 failed to contain contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's preferred hospital. Interview with owner revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.
