In the preschool restroom, a small section of the sheet rock was exposed on the purple wall.

- (2) A toilet room shall:
- (a) 1. Be provided for each gender; or
- 2. A plan shall be implemented to use the same toilet room at separate times;

- (c) Be cleaned and disinfected daily.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was a strong smell of urine in the boys' restroom adjacent to the four-year-old's room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the two-year-old caregiver did not wash her hands after she wiped a child's nose.

The same two-year-old caregiver wore gloves but did not wash her hands before she diapered a child in the two-year-old room.
