Through interview with staff-in-charge, the surveyor learned that children do utilize this restroom. The items were within reach and accessible to the children.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A child's (DOE: 09/03/20) file did not contain a contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital.
- 2. A child's (DOE: 11/01/20) file did not contain a contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital or family physician.
- 3. A child's (DOE: 11/01/20) file did not contain an authorization form for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence.
- 4. A child's (DOE: 11/01/20) file did not contain the name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

Based on observation, the surveyor observed one (1) four-year-old child to be in the same classroom as the two- and three-year-old children. Through interview with staff, the surveyor learned that the child had been in the classroom for approximately thirty (30) minutes; therefore, the child did not remain in the same group throughout the day.
