- (1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.
- (2) A child care staff member hired on or after January 1, 2018, shall:
- (a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or
- (b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;
- 2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation; and
- 3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.

Findings

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file for an employee hired on 4-2-18 did not contain the results of a criminal records check. The director was able to produce evidence of the submission for the criminal records check through the AOC, but stated that she did not save the results when they arrived via email. This employee was observed to be working alone with five (5) infants for approximately thirty (30) minutes during the survey. The director stated that the employee rarely works alone, but has in the past if there was a call-off.

- (I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that plungers in the Two Year Old bathroom and the Preschool bathroom were accessible to the children. A toilet brush was found to be accessible to the children in the Pre-K bathroom. In addition, it was found that an infant was fed in a highchair, however, the safety straps were not secured around the child.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:280;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the file for an employee hired on 4-2-18 did not contain the results of a criminal records check. This employee was observed to be working alone with five (5) infants for approximately thirty (30) minutes during the survey. The director stated that the employee rarely works alone, but has in the past if there was a call-off

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file for an employee hired on 4-2-18 did not contain evidence of a high school diploma, GED or Commonwealth Childcare Credential.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file and ECE-TRIS record for an employee hired on 3-27-17 contained evidence of Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training being completed on 2-5-13. This date is not within the required five (5) year timeframe.

- (b) Allowed to air dry; and
- (c) Protected from contamination.
- (16) Toothpaste used by multiple children shall be dispensed onto an intermediate surface, such as waxed paper, to avoid cross contamination.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the children's toothbrushes in the Preschool classroom were not labeled. The children's initials were written on the plastic holder, but their names were not on the toothbrushes.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12 if an epinephrine autoinjector is administered to a child: or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that a bottle of Hydroxyzine PAM capsules (generic for Vistaril) was being stored in an unlocked small clear tote in an unlocked cabinet in the Pre-K classroom. The medication was found to belong to a staff member. In addition, it was found that the medication description stated that the capsules were pink and yellow The bottle was found to contain pink and yellow capsules as well as green and teal capsules, therefore the green and teal capsules were not kept in the original container.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that three (3) of the crib sheets on the crib mattresses in the Infant classroom were loose and wrinkled.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the teachers in several classrooms wash dishes such as sippy cups, bowls and silverware in the classroom sinks. The facility does not have a food service permit which is required to wash dishes.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file for one (1) eligible employee did not contain evidence of an annual professional development plan being completed.

1185 - Confidentiality/Maintenance/Access

- (2) A child-care center shall:
- (a) Maintain the confidentiality of a child's record and information concerning a child or the child's parent;
- (b) Maintain all records for five (5) years; and
- (c) Provide the cabinet access and information in the completion of the investigation pursuant to KRS 620.030(4) and (5).

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that allergies for a child were posted in the Preschool classroom. The facility did not have documentation on file stating that they had permission from the child's parents to post the allergies.

1195 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

- (12) A fire drill shall be conducted during hours of operation:
- (a) At least monthly; and
- (b) Documented.
- (13) An earthquake drill and a tornado drill shall be:

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the fire drill documentation did not include evidence of a fire drill being conducted in March of 2018.
